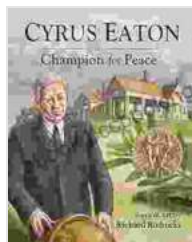


Cyrus Eaton: Champion for Peace in the Nuclear Age

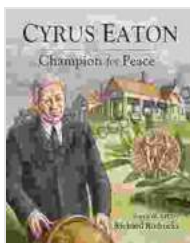

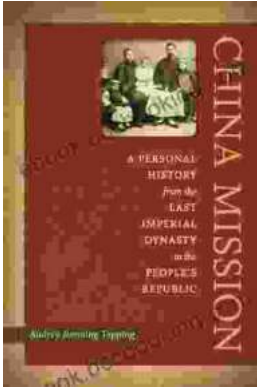

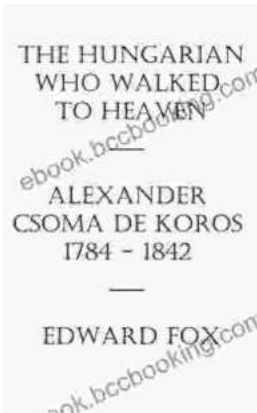
