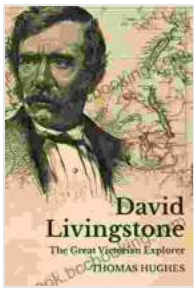


David Livingstone: The Great Victorian Explorer

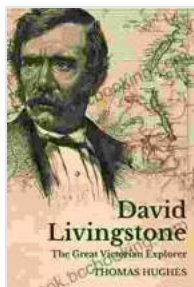
