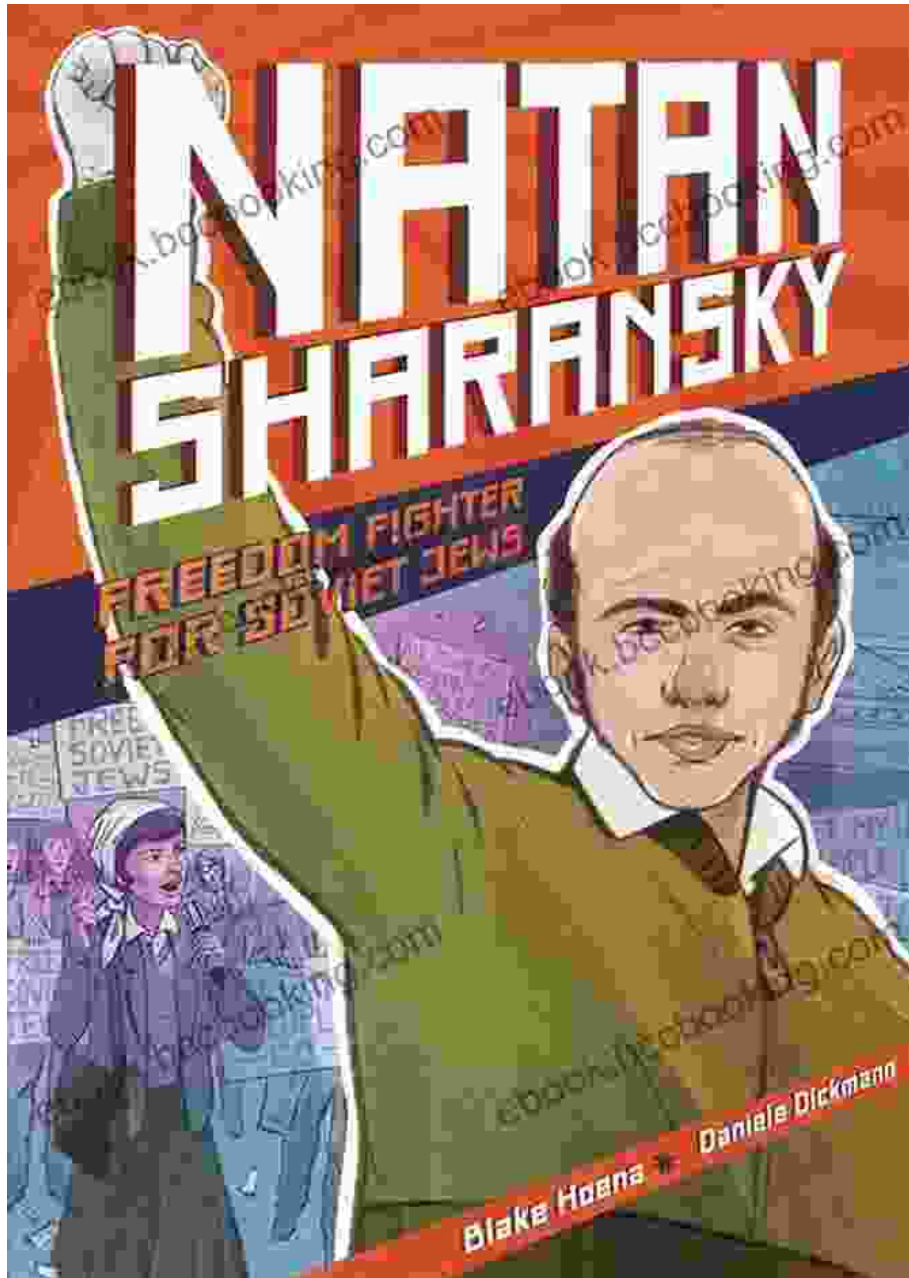
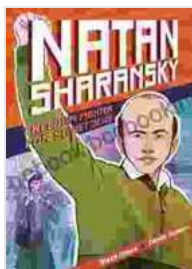


Natan Sharansky: Freedom Fighter for Soviet Jews

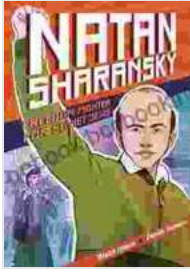

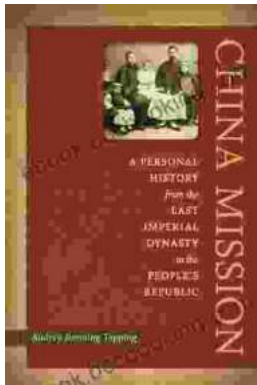

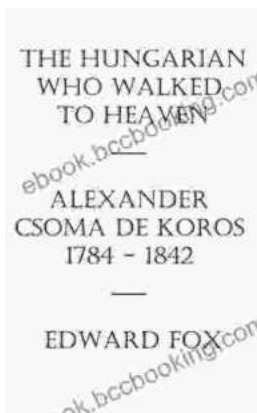
