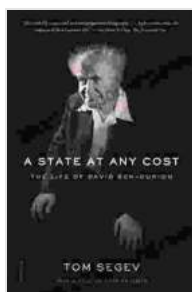

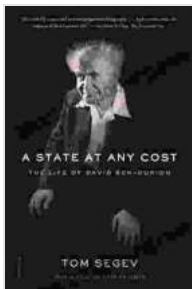


David Ben-Gurion reading the Declaration of Independence of the State of Israel on May 14, 1948.

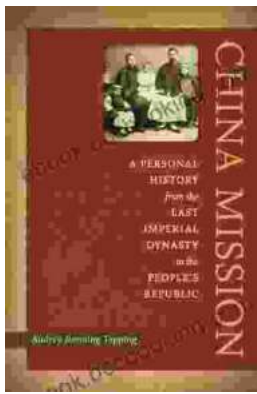

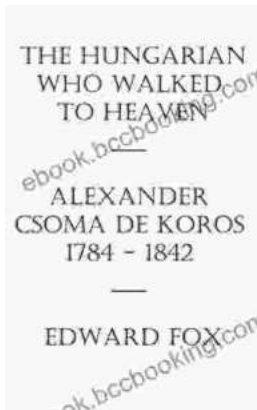
